<u>Summary</u>: With a nett increase of just over \$750 this has been a solid result for the year.

Income: \$8000 generous donation from the family of Eric Jewell (in 2018) Income: \$5000 another generous donation from the family of Eric (in 2020) Expense: \$1200 for the inaugural 2018 Eric J. Jewell Award Expense: \$1449.60 for the 2019 Eric J. Jewel Award – see new webpage

<u>Current 2020 Balance</u>: \$10350.40. This balance plus \$2649.60 of Vic Flight: funds have been combined into a Term Deposit* of \$8000 to earn interest (1.5%) and a second Term Deposit of \$5000* about to be opened, earning max. interest rate. In the coming months the applicants for the 2020 Eric J. Jewell Award will be reviewed and the winner selected.

Highlights:

+ We purchased a New Laptop and a New Printer; described in the last Newsletter with Grants that were received from the Vic State Govt. and the Federal Govt.

+ A new project for the year was our 458 Polos. Well done to our Historian Peter for spearheading this. The high quality finished polo incorporates a quality level of 22,000 stitches.

+ Our term deposit strategy yielded \$207.87 of interest which almost covered the Newsletter production and postage costs for the year!

+ Additional highlights were: Seven very generous donations (\$793) more than covering the cost of our website. And \$330 of Memorabilia sales (DVDs, Iconic photos, Badges, Caps, Polos). Thanks to "Hedgy" Peter Hedgcock, our Historian who runs the Memorabilia Shop. This is our sixth full year for the Shop. See the webpage: http://458raafsquadron.org/memorabilia-shop.html

+ A grant has been applied for to cover the cost of a special Newsletter to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of the end of WWII and the role the Squadron played in it. This special Newsletter will be published around August 2020.
