

Jack and his wife Audrey had gone on holiday near the Welsh border with their family - including his son and daughterin-law, visiting the UK from their home in Australia. My wife and I met up with them at the Hundreds



House inn between Ironbridge and Shrewsbury. We all had a very nice Sunday lunch and a good catch-up. It's still Jack's hope for us to have some form of reunion at the RAF Club in London during 2018 - the 100th anniversary of the Royal Air Force. Sadly, the numbers of 458-ers in the UK is now very small indeed, and those who are still with us - all in their nineties - are either too infirm or find it hard to travel any distance. Thanks to an incredible coincidence Jack has come across a 458 member who hasn't been on our radar for a long time (literally). Jack was visiting an eye hospital in the south of England for an appointment when he got chatting to another man, aged 95. The man said he was Douglas Pierce, and he was on the squadron for some time in Bone and elsewhere as a radar specialist. Jack explained that he was a pilot and their paths had probably crossed at some point, though they weren't sure if they had ever met each other. Jack and Douglas only had time for a five minute chat but they hope to get together again to swap stories.

I have some news of Leon Armstrong, another 458 pilot - 98 years old on Boxing Day. His son Paul has told me Leon has left his home in Birmingham and is now in a care home in Worcestershire. Paul says his dad is very happy, seems to have settled into his new home and is doing fine. These days he walks with the aid of a frame but he's been getting about on various trips - for example to Bourton-on-the-Water in the Cotswolds and to the Severn Valley Railway, a steam heritage line. Leon has a lot of knowledge of railways having worked in management on the London Underground.I'll keep you all posted about the RAF Club. We have had two 458 meetings there in recent years. It's a fantastic venue, like a corner of old England frozen in time.





Book Launch Excerpt from DVA Magazine.

'Dear Everybody – Letters from a Bomber Command Pilot' was launched in September (2017) at the RAF Club in London which some 30 people attended, including the Vice Chairman, Air Commodore Peacock-Edwards who wrote the Foreword.

The Book tells the personal story of a Bomber Command pilot during his six years he spent servicing overseas. Bill McFadden, DFM, Légion d'Honneur wrote copious letters home to his family in Queensland. They were kept and then returned to him after the war. These letters form the basis of Dear Everybody – It is interspersed with explanations for the reader as to the place he was writing from and what was happening at that time in the bigger sphere of the conflict. When Bill was writing home, he was always conscious of the Censor. Dear Everybody - follows on from last year's publication of Survival of a Bomber Command Pilot which described how he so often narrowly missed death.
