Please collect yours before the Reunion commences. There's a lot of us around and it's our way of knowing you've arrived.


WELCOMING RECEPTION

As we said, there's a lot of us around so we can't hold the reception in the restaurant as originally planned. Instead we are using the downstairs conference area of the Yaldara Motel which is a good thing because we want you to use this as your club and general meeting place during the Reunion. We are calling it THE SERGEANTS MESS. You'll find more information about this on page 19.

The main entrance is within the motel complex. Turn right as you enter and it is at the end of the front wing of units between Rooms 28 and 29. The door is marked SERGEANTS MESS and there are fairly steep steps leading down to the conference area. There is also a rear entrance without steps outside the complex.

The Reception commences at 6.30 pm. Drinks and savouries will be served. Prior to its ending at 8 pm, there will be a brief ceremony of remembrance for departed comrades. For those wanting dinner, the motel's restaurant is well worth a visit. It can seat 80 people at a time. For those wishing to bat on, the bar will remain open for the evening.

VISIT TO RAAF BASE, EDINBURGH

There are four coaches taking us to Edinburgh, a journey of about 45 minutes. You'll be advised what coach to take.

One coach leaves the Weintal Motel, Tanunda, at 9 am, picks up at Tanunda Hotel five minutes later and fills at the Yaldara Motel, Lyndoch, leaving there at 9.15 am and arriving at Edinburgh at approximately 10 am.

A second coach leaves the Barossa Motor Lodge at 9.10 am and travels direct to Edinburgh.


The other two coaches leave from Yaldara at 9.05 and 9.10 am, the first one stopping to pick up at Lyndoch Caravan Park on the way.

Edinburgh is one of the largest air force bases in Australia and the home of the RAAF's Long Range Maritime Patrol aircraft — the P3C Orion.

Since we arranged this visit, the Fincastle Trophy Competition, which was to be held in New Zealand this year, has been transferred to Edinburgh. This is a competition between the air forces of Commonwealth countries who are awarded points for dummy attacks on submarines. The RAF will be flying Nimrods, the Canadians Auroras and the RAAF and RNZAF have Orions.

This year's Fincastle is being held, would you believe, during the week of our visit so there will have to be some restrictions on visiting No 92 Wing which will be explained hereunder. However, since we were a Coastal Command squadron, the Base is giving us special treatment.

E.T.A. Edinburgh is 10 am. We get off the coaches at the Officers Mess. This is a comfort stop. From there it is a very short walk to the Base Cinema where, at 10.25 am, the Commander, Maritime Patrol Group, Air Commodore Stafford James AFC, will welcome us and the Base Commander, Group Captain Allan Gilbert, will personally give us a presentation, with slides, describing all the units

Ex 458 pilots will be interested to know that Group Captain Gilbert is one of the few navigator aircraft captains. He flew in Nimrods. Ex 458 navigators should wipe those smug grins off their faces.

At 11.15 am we board the coaches again and commence a tour of the Base. The coaches will be equipped with PA systems and there will be an RAAF officer on each of them to act as tour guide.


RAAF Edinburgh is a small town in itself with all amenities and a population of some 2,000 including about 200 civilian personnel. As well as the four squadrons of No 92 Wing (Nos 10, 11, 292 and 492 Squadrons), and No 24 'City of Adelaide' Squadron, it has a Base Support Wing, a Recruit Training Unit, an Airmen Aircrew Flying Training School, an Aircraft Research and Development Unit and an Electronic Warfare Operational Support Unit.

At the end of this tour we will disembark from the coaches at the Sergeants Mess (theirs not ours) where, from 11.45 am to 12.55 pm, a buffet lunch will be served that can be eaten in the mess with the NCOs or in a sheltered outside area. A section of the mess bar will be open and marked '458 Members Only'. Glasses, carafes of red and white wine and orange juice and jugs of beer can be obtained there without charge. The SA Flight will pay the drinks bill afterwards.

Then into the coaches again but this time the men and the ladies go separately. The reason for this blatant sexism is the Fincastle Trophy Competition. The RAAF is bending over backwards to allow us to inspect the Orions but this is their busiest time and numbers must be drastically reduced. So the visit to operational areas is for men only. Once there, they will split into three groups and visit alternately a P3C Orion; the A.R.D.U. hangar with F18's, Macchi and other trainers, Black Hawk helicopter and other aircraft; and the Life Support Equipment Section with dinghies, the modern version of the Mae West and other things you never dreamed of.



We all end up together at the Officers Mess again at 2.30 pm. Another comfort stop. Between 2.45 pm and 3 pm we leave the Base.






We should be back in our billets by around 3.45 pm.

'DICK THE TICK' DARTS TROPHY




During the course of the evening, the 'Dick The Tick' darts tournament will be held in the Sergeants Mess.

The venue is the entrance to the Reception Hall at the Chateau Yaldara Winery about 2 km down the road from the Yaldara Motel. (Pictured below).




Food will be served just inside the entrance hall. There will be tables outside on the lawn overlooking the lake, a very picturesque setting.

NIGHT WINERY TOUR AND BISTRO DINNER

This starts from 6.30 pm at the Cellar Door of Chateau Yaldara, the main entrance and visiting area of the Winery.


For those not staying at Lyndoch, a courtesy coach will be provided (as mentioned on Page 20) leaving the Tanunda motels from 6 pm and returning to Tanunda from the Winery at 10.30 pm.



Champagne and hors d'oeuvres will be served in the wine tasting area on arrival. The winery tours will be conducted in groups of about 40. (There are about 140 people registered for this.) You will be taken through the winery storage areas and the impressive baroque Chateau with its remarkable collection of porcelain and period furniture.



Dinner commences at 7.30 pm in the beautiful Bistro with its garden setting. Main course is sea perch with banana and pineapple, nut sauce; chicken breast pocketed with mandarin and lack schinken with champagne and mustard seed sauce; pork and prune noisette wrapped in bacon with cider and apple sauce. For dessert there is rum and raisin chocolate mousse and apple and apricot strudel.

DEDICATION OF 458 SQUADRON RAAF RESERVE RENMARK

Coaches leave at 9 am for the two and a half hour journey to Renmark.

One coach picks up first at Lyndoch Caravan Park, fills at Yaldara and proceeds to Renmark.

A second coach fills at Yaldara.

A third coach leaves Yaldara with 25 vacant seats and fills at Barossa Motor Lodge before proceeding to Renmark.


The fourth coach picks up first at Tanunda Hotel, then Barossa Motor Lodge, then Weintal.

The 220 km journey is mostly along the Sturt Highway (Route 20). After leaving Truro, we descend into scrub plains which extend for about 45 km until we reach the Murray at Blanchetown. Then another 40 km of mallee plain until we re-join the Murray at Waikerie. Watch out for the Waikerie Gliding Club on your left before you get there. We follow the Murray from Waikerie via Kingston, Barmera and Berri to Renmark.


At Renmark we are the guests of Fee and Ian Showell.

Our E.T.A. is 11.30 am at the tower and Information Centre on Ian's ambitious and imaginative Jane Eliza Estate. Headquarters of his Libba Libba Houseboats can be seen nearby. We will be welcomed there by the Mayor of Renmark.

At the centre, where tea and coffee will be available, you will see a large scale model of the estate. There will also be an original painting of a 458 Squadron




Wellington shining its Leigh Light on a fishing fleet off Gibraltar. This was part of a remarkable exhibition of over 30 large oil paintings of operational aircraft in World War II by Renmark artist, Frank Harding. They were first exhibited in Adelaide last year at Legacy House and further exhibitions are planned. Frank Harding died this year. The 458 painting is on loan courtesy of Adelaide Legacy and Frank's widow, Nan Harding.



The Information Centre

From the Centre we are taken to the 458 RAAF Reserve. Ian has prepared this with lavish and loving care. He has planted lawn, trees — including over 50 palm trees — and the petunias and 50 rose bushes should be in full bloom by this time. As well as the Australian flag, the Union Jack and the New Zealand and Canadian flags will fly to represent nationalities serving on the Squadron.

Renmark children whose fathers served in the RAAF will have planted most of the trees. We are also remembering here the many RAAF dead who came from Renmark and the Riverland, including Dam Buster Bob Hay. The Reserve has been handed over to the Renmark Corporation for perpetual maintenance.






There will be two official tables with name places on them. Our guests will sit there.







It is a spacious, comfortable complex with many pleasing features.




Beyond its impressive panelled bar is a games room with a full-size billiard/pool table, table tennis table and dart board.


